In the Bleak Midwinter

In my mind, Christina Rossetti is one of the greatest poets of the 19th century, having written more than 50 poems by the time she was 16. Her sense of longing and sadness is ever evident in the song *In the Bleak Midwinter*. I own several versions of the song, with my favorites being the Choir of Christ's College and The Brilliance's version from the Advent, Volume 2, album.

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan, Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago.

Our God, heaven cannot hold him, nor earth sustain; Heaven and earth shall flee away when he comes to reign.

In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed The Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ.

What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give him: give my heart.

The beauty of this poem for me is how it perfectly juxtaposes both sadness and hope. Every day, we are wrecked by the ravages of the Fall, and yet, every day, we live in the reality that Jesus came, lived, and died for us.

He came, lived, and died for the rescue and redemption of this world.

Our hope lies in the truth expressed in verse two, that heaven cannot hold our God. . . that he will come to reign. The ravages of the Fall have made us poor, living in the bleak midwinter.

It's January, one of the coldest months in most places in the United States. But it's a high of 87 in the southernmost counties, reminding us of the incredible way God built our world, and how a bleak midwinter is not always, and not forever.

Colossians 1:16 tells us, "For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him."



In our own Connecticut midwinter, we may feel poor. We may feel cold and even bleak.

But then we remember that he is coming.

This is not a call to "grin and bear it" nor is it a command to "just choose joy" (how toxic is that?). This is not a call to "forget it and move

on." It's a call to live in and through the bleak midwinter, which we can only do because of the hope promised to us in Scripture: that Jesus has supreme authority over this earth, and the story isn't finished yet.

What does this living in hope through the midwinter look like? I think Rosetti herself answers it in her song: We can give him our hearts.

Summary: Quarterly Meeting of December 15

Banners are being hung around the church to remind us of our mission and vison statements.

Coffee Hour assignments were discussed. The congregation agreed that it isn't necessary to provide snacks each time. Purchased snacks (provided by the church or donated) can be stored and made available and the boards can invite persons not on their boards to help serve during their assigned months.

Restructuring the Sunday school program so that students' parents are encouraged to become more involved in the church is being investigated.

General Fund offerings through 48 weeks were over budget for the period. General fund offerings had been below budget, but a large late-year donation brought them above budget. The donation was not from a source that can be counted on for planning the 2025 budget.

All bills are up to date, with several bills still to come in December. We will need another fuel oil delivery as well. Restricted amounts left over for pew Bibles and the screens project will be moved to the General Fund. Restricted amounts for the Servant Keeper database and office supplies will be moved to the General Fund. A congregation member offered to cover a restricted fund negative balance for CE-UNITE.

The Diaconate is considering whether or not to continue holding Christmas Eve worship next year. A Christmas movie night is scheduled, as well as a worship service and reception honoring Ann and Ted Ryan, who are moving to Ohio at the end of December. If a congregation member notes that someone who usually attends is absent, they should notify someone on the Diaconate so the Diaconate can reach out to the absent person.

The Trustees plan to address steeple repairs in 2025.

The Sunday school will give a Christmas concert during worship on December 15. The fall family dance was well attended. Sunday school attendance is growing.

Training on how to talk to people about God will continue. Fourteen Christmas Child boxes were sent to Samaritan's Purse this year. The church is asked to provide Christmas gifts for two local families in need. We will provide the Thomaston 150th Anniversary committee with a short article and photos for the anniversary's commemorative book. The Playground Project has shipped 21 donated playgrounds to Guatemala, and more donations are expected.

WM is delivering 21 ditty bags to the Seafarers' Mission.

The church's database program has been migrated to the Servant Keeper cloud. A group of people are learning how to operate the new screen system during worship. Difficulty seeing the screens from the wings will be addressed in 2025. The wings were wired for this with the original installation, so it will not be difficult or expensive to install additional screens.

A bylaws change was proposed and approved to be presented for final approval at the Annual meeting to reduce the number of official church business meetings. The goal is to prevent too many meetings from interfering with actual ministry activities. The changes eliminate the December Quarterly meeting before the January Annual meeting and moves the election of officers to the Annual meeting. Terms will begin on February 1 instead of January 1.
